# The Chapter Letter The Third Sunday after Trinity Sunday 6 July 2025



**8.30 a.m. Holy Communion (BCP):** The Collect, Epistle, and Gospel for the Third Sunday after Trinity begin on page 160 of the Book of Common Prayer.

**Welcome:** A very warm welcome to the Cathedral, particularly if you are a visitor or here for the first time. We would be delighted to meet you, so do please make yourself known to one of the clergy after the service. Everybody is always welcome to stay and enjoy time together over tea and filter coffee after the Cathedral Eucharist, where there are Welcomers available - please do seek them out if you have questions or simply to chat.

**Visiting Choir:** Huge thanks to our visiting choir who are singing the services this week. Saint Thomas' Episcopal is a parish and parochial school in Houston, Texas. The student choir of the school and the adult choir serving the parish very often collaborate on liturgical and concert projects, functioning as a single intergenerational group. This is the Saint Thomas' choirs' first trip abroad and cathedral residency in the 70-year history of the institution. Before their week of services at Wells Cathedral, the choir sang Evensong at St. Nicholas' Basilica in Amsterdam.

Support the Ministry Experience Scheme: In September, we are delighted to be welcoming Alfie Rendell and Finlay (Fin) James to the Cathedral for their Ministry Experience Scheme (MES) year. This is an important Church of England scheme for 18 to 30-year-olds which gives participants the opportunity to discover their unique gifts and skills through Christian ministry and leadership experience. Each person's year will look different, but it will be formed around practical experience such as pastoral visiting, youth work, supporting events and Sunday services. It also includes theological study. The scheme will support Alfie and Fin to discern their gifts and form a valuable foundation for their future paths in service and faith. Although the Diocese of Bath and Wells are generously funding the majority of this year, we are currently facing a shortfall of £2,000. Your support could make a crucial difference and help to ensure Alfie and Fin are able to make the most of this extraordinary experience. Kinda Dusty Presents: The Music of Frankie Valli and The Four Seasons By Candlelight: On Saturday 19 July at 7.30 p.m., join Kinda Dusty for an incredible night of smash hits made famous by Frankie Valli and the Four Seasons, performed by one of the UK's leading tribute shows and featuring an epic band. Performing a collection of classics such as *Sherry, Walk Like A Man* and *Oh What a Night*, this group takes you right back to *late December back in '63*.

**Charity of the Month:** In the South Quire Aisle, you will find a noticeboard where each month different charities are invited to publicise information about

their work and where it is possible for individuals to make donations to that charity. In July, the focus is on Cats Protection. From humble beginnings in 1927, Cats Protection has grown to become the UK's leading cat charity. It helps an estimated 157,000 cats and kittens a year through its national network which comprises approximately 210 volunteer-run branches and 34 centres.

**Cider and Cheese Festival:** On **Saturday 27 September**, enjoy a relaxed and lively afternoon at Wells Cathedral as you sample a wide range of local ciders and cheeses, discover new favourites and soak up the atmosphere with live music and great company. The Festival is scheduled to start at 12 noon and run until 9.00 p.m. the same evening. Alongside stands from local cider and cheese producers, there will be a range of soft drink and food stalls.

Tickets are now available and include access to all events on the day, two half-pint drink tokens, and a commemorative glass to use on the day and take home. Additional tokens may be purchased for  $\pounds 2.50$  each.
