The Chapter Letter The Fifth Sunday after Trinity Sunday 20 July 2025



8.30 a.m. Holy Communion (BCP): The Collect, Epistle, and Gospel for the Fifth Sunday after Trinity begin on page 163 of the Book of Common Prayer.

This week, The Reverend Melvyn Matthews' Permission to Officiate will come to an end. Melvyn was licensed 38 years ago and his last post was as Canon Chancellor of Wells Cathedral, until his retirement in 2005. We thank God for Melvyn's faithful ministry and dedicated service over the last 38 years.

The Reverend Edward Day, Cathedral Curate, is at Taizé, in Southern France with Bishop Michael and a group of young adults from the Diocese of Bath and Wells (and from the Dioceses of Bristol, Portsmouth, Norwich, York, and Leeds) until Sunday 27 July. We pray that all those attending will deepen their relationship with God through community, chants, silence, personal reflection, and making new friends.

The Reverend Philip Harbridge: Philip has been a Priest Vicar at the Cathedral since 2020 and is leaving us to become Chaplain and Interfaith Officer at Jesus College, Oxford. He is preaching at Choral Evensong this afternoon. Many thanks to Philip for his ministry here at Wells Cathedral and we pray for God's blessing on him in his new role in Oxford.

Welcome: A very warm welcome to the Cathedral, particularly if you are a visitor or here for the first time. Visiting Choir - Monday 21 to Sunday 27 July: The Good Shepherd Choir in Lexington, Kentucky, USA, sings weekly for Eucharist on Sundays and Evensong on Wednesdays. Their repertoire includes traditional Anglican and Episcopal repertoire, and in the past few years, an increasing number of American Spirituals. Previous choir pilgrimages have included St. Alban's Cathedral, Durham Cathedral, the American Cathedral in Paris, and more.

INEQE Safeguarding report: The results of the independent review into safeguarding in the Diocese of Bath and Wells and Wells Cathedral have now been published and are available here: https://www.wellscathedral.org.uk/archives/173057365 We are thrilled with the report which recognises how far we have come. In the press release this week, the Dean states: "We warmly welcome the audit findings and

recommendations. I am clear that the improvements to our safeguarding culture acknowledged in this report are the shared achievements of the whole team of volunteers, staff and clergy at Wells Cathedral, who work tirelessly towards upholding the highest standards of care. I am grateful for their commitment and for all they do."

I personally hope that this coming year in our wonderful Cathedral will help me to discern my personal sense of calling to the priesthood and I know that partaking in the wide range of ministries that our Cathedral offers will help me do just that. I'm also very excited to be able to grow in my faith alongside you all and hope we can help each other to do just that."

Fin writes: "Hello, my name is Finlay James and I'm delighted to be joining the community here at the Cathedral as part of the Ministry Experience Scheme. I have always loved Wells, having often visited when I was younger and now having the opportunity to live here fills me with great joy. I come from a background in church ministry, law and finance, having spent the past year involved in youth work, worship and being employed as the Site Assistant within my local church of St Paul's in Weston-super-Mare. I'm currently discerning a call to ordained ministry with a particular interest in chaplaincy, and I'm really looking forward to this year of deepening my faith through service, reflection and walking alongside others in this beautiful and prayerful place. I hope to grow not only in my theological understanding but also my spirituality, really having the chance to embed myself into the prayer rhythm here at the
