8.30 a.m. Holy Communion (BCP): The Collect, Epistle, and Gospel for the Seventh Sunday after Trinity begin on page 167 of the Book of Common Prayer.

Modern Day Pilgrimage: On Saturday 13 and Sunday 14 September, a two-day journey from Bath Abbey to Wells Cathedral will take place, following the 30-mile historic route once taken by Medieval Pilgrims. It is a distance of approximately 30 miles. On Saturday, pilgrims will leave Bath Abbey and walk approximately 18 miles to Hinton Blewett and on Sunday, pilgrims will walk from Hinton Blewett to Wells, finishing at the Cathedral West Front around 2.00 p.m., in time for a special Evensong at 3.00 p.m. The pilgrimage is being led by Annie Maw, who broke her spine in a near-fatal accident. 25% of the money raised will support The City of Wells Almshouses and 75% will support *Humanity and Inclusion*, an organisation that care for vulnerable elderly people in Eastern Ukraine who are unable to move away and are living in truly terrible circumstances.
