Bartholomew the Apostle Sunday 24 August 2025



8.30 a.m. Holy Communion (BCP): The Collect, Epistle, and Gospel for St Bartholomew begin on page 224 of the Book of Common Prayer.

Welcome: A very warm welcome to the Cathedral, particularly if you are a visitor or here for the first time. We would be delighted to meet you, so do please make yourself known to one of the clergy after the service. Everybody is always welcome to stay and enjoy time together over tea and filter coffee after the Cathedral Eucharist, where there are Welcomers available - please do seek them out if you have questions or simply to chat.

Huge thanks go to the Universities in London Church Choir who sang the services so beautifully this week. They will be singing at the Cathedral Eucharist this morning and Choral Evensong this afternoon.

Visiting Choir - Monday 25 to Thursday 28 August: The Girls' Choir at the Collegiate Church of St Mary, Warwick, was founded in 1990 by the then Director of Music, Simon Lole, and sings an upper-voices Choral Evensong each week, collaborating with the Gentlemen of the Choir for Sunday Eucharists and Evensongs throughout the church year, and as part of the combined full foundation choir at special events and major festivals. Open to girls aged between 7 and 18, choristers receive expert tuition in vocal technique, music theory, and sight-reading, enabling them to tackle a broad and challenging repertoire, as heard on frequent BBC radio and TV broadcasts alongside the Gentlemen of the Choir. The Girl Choristers' annual performances of Britten's Ceremony of Carols in December and Pergolesi's Stabat Mater during Holy Week have become staple events in the Warwick calendar, and the Gentlemen boast a hearty commitment to the Choir's social life.

Visiting Choir - Friday 29 to Sunday 31 August: St Christopher's Chamber Choir was formed in about 2000 by the late Ralph Franklin, and is an amalgam from members of choirs he directed during his time as Director of Music at St Neot's Parish Church; Howden Minster; St Paul's Church, Bedford; All Saints Wokingham, and Dunster Parish Church. The Choir have sung at a dozen or so Cathedrals or Abbeys. After Ralph's unexpected death in July 2012, it was decided to continue singing, and one of the basses, Gary Mudd (who is also an experienced choir director) took over as Musical Director. The organist is Andrew Christer, who was organist at Darlington Parish Church (the "Railwayman's church"). One of Ralph's particular "fortes" was in preparing the Choir for singing the Psalms, and they pride themselves on that aspect of their singing. If the Cathedral or place of worship is in agreement, they often sing the music of a Bedfordshire composer, Paul Edwards.
