8.30 a.m. Holy Communion (BCP): The Collect, Epistle, and Gospel for the Fifteenth Sunday after Trinity begin on page 180 of the Book of Common Prayer.

Grand Organ Project: We are delighted to share that the first phase of our long-awaited Grand Organ refurbishment will begin in January. After years of dedicated service - and with our talented organists often masking the instrument's growing faults - it has become clear that urgent action is needed to preserve this vital part of our Cathedral's musical life. Specialist restorers Harrison and Harrison will soon begin the careful process of removing, repairing, and restoring all 5000 pipes, along with overhauling the console, pedals and stops. Thanks to the generous support of the Friends of Wells Cathedral and a private donor, we are off to a strong start, but further funds are needed to complete this ambitious project. Please look out for details of our upcoming fundraising campaign, and thank you for your continued support as we work to safeguard the future of music at Wells Cathedral.

Visiting Choir: On **Friday 3 October**, the Chamber Choir of King's College, Taunton, will be singing at Choral Evensong. The Chamber Choir are a smaller group of singers than the College Chapel Choir and learn both sacred and secular music. They are comfortable with such pieces as Wesley's "Thou wilt keep him in Perfect Peace" and "Wannabe – a Spice Girls' madrigal". This flexible approach means that they are much in demand in school and in the local area. Made up of all year groups at the school, they pride themselves on an inclusive approach and excellent musicality.

Wells Art Contemporary: From Wednesday 8 October to Saturday I November, you can enjoy an international exhibition of innovative contemporary art in the stunning setting of Wells Cathedral. The exhibition features works across painting, sculpture, photography, digital media, textiles, and more, divided between an extensive white-wall exhibition in the Cloisters and many installations around the building itself.

Kaleidoscope Chamber Project: On Thursday 9 October, the Kaleidoscope Chamber Collective will be giving a concert at The Cedars Hall.
