# The Sixteenth Sunday after Trinity Sunday 5 October 2025



**8.30 a.m. Holy Communion (BCP):** The Collect, Epistle, and Gospel for the Sixteenth Sunday after Trinity begin on page 182 of the Book of Common Prayer.

The Reverend Edward Day, *Cathedral Curate*, is presiding and preaching at St Mary Magdalene Church, Ditcheat today. We pray that both he and the community will be blessed by their time together.

**Welcome:** A very warm welcome to the Cathedral, particularly if you are a visitor or here for the first time. We would be delighted to meet you, so do please make yourself known to one of the clergy after the service. Everybody is always welcome to stay and enjoy time together over tea and filter coffee after the Cathedral Eucharist, where there are Welcomers available - please do seek them out if you have questions or simply to chat.

The atmosphere was full of warmth, welcome and community spirit.

West Front Project: After a summer of conservation work, the scaffolding on the West Front has now come down. Cliveden Conservation's Bath team have carefully cleaned and repaired the sculpture and stonework, documenting historic paint traces and earlier repairs as part of the Cathedral's ongoing conservation story. Repairs were mainly carried out using traditional lime and sand mortar, with new stone carved where necessary by skilled stonemasons. Among them was Wells resident Sam Peacock, who trained with Wells Cathedral Stonemasons based in Cheddar. The team also included experienced conservators, a newly qualified stonemason from Bath College, and was led by Berenice Humphreys. This phase continued work on the central upper levels of the West Front, following the

earlier pilot phase. We hope future phases will allow us to build on this important conservation effort. Sincere thanks to everyone involved.

Wells Art Contemporary: From Wednesday 8 October to Saturday I November, you can enjoy an international exhibition of innovative contemporary art in the stunning setting of Wells Cathedral. The exhibition features works across painting, sculpture, photography, digital media, textiles, and more, divided between an extensive white-wall exhibition in the Cloisters and many installations around the building itself.

**Organ Recital:** The next lunchtime organ recital will take place on **Thursday 9 October** at 1.05 p.m., and will be given by Joseph Wicks, Organist and Tenor in *The Gesualdo Six*. Admission is included with entry to the Cathedral, whether as a paid ticket or with a valid admission pass. There will be a retiring collection in aid of the Grand Organ Appeal. **Harvest Festival:** Please join us for our Harvest Cathedral Eucharist on **Sunday 12 October.** Everyone is invited to bring non-perishable food items to support those in need. All donations will go to local food banks and charities. Please give generously in support of this worthwhile cause.

**Taste and See:** The Cathedral Meditation Group is an opportunity to share in thirty minutes of silent prayer which follows a brief introduction. Such prayer is a chance to deepen our personal relationship with God and to contribute to the prayer-life of the Cathedral. All are most welcome. The next session will be on **Monday 13 October** at 6.00 p.m. in the Lady Chapel.

Dedication Festival: On Wednesday 15 October, the Cathedral Choir will be singing Choral Evensong live on BBC Radio 3. They will be performing works by Anton Bruckner, Kenneth Leighton and Sarah MacDonald, with a newly-composed anthem by Matthew Martin and the Finale from Florence Price's Organ Sonata in D minor as the voluntary. You are invited to join us for this service, which will take place in the Quire at the earlier time of 3.00 p.m. All members of the congregation must be seated by 2.45 p.m. so please arrive in good time. Later that day, the Cathedral Chamber Choir will sing for the Dedication Festival Eucharist which will be held at 6.00 p.m.

A final call to join the Schools and Community Remembrance Exhibition: We still have a few spaces left for schools and community groups to

take part in a Remembrance Exhibition which will be on display in the Cathedral from **3 – 30 November**. We invite groups to design an exhibition board (or boards), each of which will be placed in its own niche in the Chapter House.
