Remembrance at Wells Cathedral: 1945 – 2025

Duruflé Requiem for Remembrance Sunday: This afternoon at 3.00 p.m., the Cathedral Choir will join with Wells Cathedral School Chamber Choir to offer a devotional performance of Maurice Duruflé's Requiem, interspersed with readings, and with the now familiar and much appreciated 'poppy drop'. Admission is free with a retiring collection in aid of the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal and Wells Cathedral.

Talk: Emperor Haile Selassie I in Bath and Wells: His Journey, His Faith: Join us on Wednesday I 2 November at 7.00 p.m. for a talk exploring Emperor Haile Selassie I's time in exile and his connection to Wells Cathedral.

Professor Shawn Sobers will speak on the Ethiopian Orthodox Church's influence in Christianity. Ras Benji will share insights into the Emperor's life in Bath and Wells, and Paula Ogun Hector will contribute reflections from her work on Black British heritage.

'Last Things' in Advent: In former times, the great preaching themes of Advent were Death, Judgement, Heaven and Hell. Nowadays, the build-up to Christmas seems to predominate, and the traditional penitential mood of the season all too soon gives way to the brightness of Christmas. Yet we are reminded, in Scripture and in Advent hymns, to prepare, not just for Christmas, but for the end of our lives, and for the coming of Christ at the end of time – to be mindful of death.

Here at Wells Cathedral, 'Last Things' will offer four sessions on Monday afternoons, beginning on **Monday I December** from 3.30 p.m. until 5.00 p.m. exploring themes such as 'Living with a sense of our mortality', 'Putting our affairs in order', 'Preparing for a good death', and thinking about 'What comes next – heaven or hell?' Each session begins with tea and cake, followed by short talks, discussion and prayer. There will be some visiting speakers to help with our thinking.
