# Christ the King; The Sunday Next Before Advent Sunday 23 November 2025



**8.30 a.m. Holy Communion (BCP):** The Collect, Epistle, and Gospel for the Twenty Third Sunday after Trinity begin on page 194 of the Book of Common Prayer.

**Welcome:** A very warm welcome to the Cathedral, particularly if you are a visitor or here for the first time. We would be delighted to meet you, so do please make yourself known to one of the clergy after the service. Everybody is always welcome to stay and enjoy time together over tea and filter coffee after the Cathedral Eucharist, where there are Welcomers available - please do seek them out if you have questions or simply to chat.

Lecture - Sources of Unity, from Daily Prayer to the Sunday Creed: All are warmly invited to a lecture being organised by the Canon Chancellor at 6.15 p.m. on Tuesday 25 November at Wells Cathedral. The World Council of Churches European President, The Reverend Dr Susan Durber, will be speaking about the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, and what it means for us today. No ticket is needed. The lecture will follow immediately after Evensong, which takes place at 5.15 p.m.

Cathedral Advent Carol Service: On Sunday 30 November, join us for the Advent Carol Service at 5.00 p.m. (Congregation to be seated by 4.45 p.m. please) This very special service begins with the Cathedral in darkness. The combination of music, readings, and liturgy as the procession moves around the Cathedral all come together to create an atmosphere which so powerfully embodies the Advent message. The service includes readings and traditional congregational Advent Carols, as well as wonderful music from the Cathedral Choir.

Farewell to the Organ: Please come and join in a very special event on Thursday II December at 7.30 p.m., when we will be saying au revoir to the Organ.

This is such an exciting watershed moment – scaffolding will go up around the Organ in January for a few weeks while it's dismantled and taken off to Durham for cleaning, restoration, renewal, repair and partial replacement. Our Organ will accompany the Christmas services (so long as nothing else goes wrong in the meantime!) but the evening concert on 11 December will be a very special farewell moment.

Director of Music, Tim Parsons will be playing Messiaen's La Nativity du Seigneur, a beautiful and powerful piece, perfect for the season, and which will be played again in late 2027 when we celebrate the Organ's glorious return.

Dr Anthony Crossland: On Saturday 14 March 2026, the Cathedral will be holding a special Evensong in thanksgiving for the life of Dr Anthony Crossland (1931-2025), who was Assistant Organist at Wells between 1961 and 1971 and then Organist and Master of the Choristers from 1971 until his retirement in 1996. The service will be held in the Nave at 5.15 p.m. and sung by the Cathedral Great Choir. All are welcome to join us to celebrate Anthony's life and his immense contribution to the music and ministry of Wells Cathedral over so many years.

Charity of the Month: In the South Quire Aisle, you will find a noticeboard where each month different charities are invited to publicise information about their work and where it is possible for individuals to make donations to that charity. In November, the focus is on the Royal British Legion's Poppy Appeal.
