8.30 a.m. Holy Communion (BCP): The Collect, Epistle, and Gospel for the First Sunday in Advent begin on page 47 of the Book of Common Prayer.

The Reverend Edward Day, *Cathedral Curate*, is presiding and preaching at both St Mary Magdalene Church, Wookey Hole and St Cuthbert's Church, Wells today. We pray that both he and the communities will be blessed by their time together.

Welcome: A very warm welcome to the Cathedral, particularly if you are a visitor or here for the first time. We would be delighted to meet you, so do please make yourself known to one of the clergy after the service. Everybody is always welcome to stay and enjoy time together over tea and filter coffee after the Cathedral Eucharist, where there are Welcomers available - please do seek them out if you have questions or simply to chat.

Cathedral Advent Carol Service: On Sunday 30 November, join us for the Advent Carol Service at 5.00 p.m. (Congregation to be seated by 4.45 p.m., please) This very special service begins with the Cathedral in darkness. The combination of music, readings and liturgy as the procession moves around the Cathedral all come together to create an atmosphere which so powerfully embodies the Advent message. The service includes readings and traditional congregational Advent Carols, as well as wonderful music from the Cathedral Choir.

Advent Celebration and 'Last Things' Advent course: A reminder for pre-booked participants: The Advent Celebration with the Dean and the Reverend Mary Lewis takes place tomorrow morning, **Monday I December**, from 9.00 a.m. until 11.00 a.m. in the Chapter Room. Light refreshments, including tea, coffee and mince pies, will be served.

The Reverend Rosey Lunn's Advent course begins at 3.30 p.m. in the Education Room on **Monday I December.** The theme of the first session is *Living with a sense of our mortality*. The session will begin with tea and cake, followed by short talks, questions and discussions.

Taste and See: The Cathedral Meditation Group is an opportunity to share in thirty minutes of silent prayer which follows a brief introduction. Such prayer is a chance to deepen our personal relationship with God and to contribute to the prayer-life of the Cathedral. All are most welcome. The next session will be on **Monday I December,** at 6.00 p.m. in the Lady Chapel. If you are just coming for the meditation, please enter via the North Door.

Farewell to the Organ: Please come and join in a very special event on Thursday II December at 7.30 p.m., when we will be saying au revoir to the Organ.

This is such an exciting watershed moment – scaffolding will go up around the Organ in January for a few weeks while it's dismantled and taken off to Durham for cleaning, restoration, renewal, repair and partial replacement. Our Organ will accompany the Christmas services (so long as nothing else goes wrong in the meantime!) but the evening concert on 11 December will be a very special farewell moment.

Director of Music, Tim Parsons will be playing Messiaen's La Nativity du Seigneur, a beautiful and powerful piece, perfect for the season, and which will be played again in late 2027 when we celebrate the Organ's glorious return.

Sue Jones (b. 30 April 1928): We are sorry to announce that Sue died peacefully at her home in King Alfred Courtyard on 20 November. She was a regular member of our Cathedral Congregation after her move to Wells, being a great lover of the Cathedral music. Before moving here, she had sung in the Kidderminster Choral Society. There will be a private Cremation Service at the Mendip Crematorium, mainly for family members, on Thursday 11 December taken by our Priest Vicar Emeritus John Sclater. In the New Year, the family are hoping to arrange a celebration of her life in Wells Cathedral. We remember her son Andy and daughter Lucy in our prayers and give thanks for her life. May she rest in peace.

Dr Anthony Crossland: On Saturday 14 March 2026, the Cathedral will be holding a special Evensong in thanksgiving for the life of Dr Anthony Crossland (1931-2025), who was Assistant Organist at Wells between 1961 and 1971 and then Organist and Master of the Choristers from 1971 until his retirement in 1996. The service will be held in the Nave at 5.15 p.m. and sung by the Cathedral Great Choir. All are welcome to join us to celebrate Anthony's life and his immense contribution to the music and ministry of Wells Cathedral over so many years.
