Farewell to the Organ: Please come and join in a very special event on Thursday II December at 7.30 p.m., when we will be saying au revoir to the Organ.

This is such an exciting watershed moment – scaffolding will go up around the Organ in January for a few weeks while it's dismantled and taken off to Durham for cleaning, restoration, renewal, repair and partial replacement. Our Organ will accompany the Christmas services (so long as nothing else goes wrong in the meantime!) but the evening concert on II December will be a very special farewell moment.

Director of Music, Tim Parsons will be playing Messiaen's La Nativity du Seigneur, a beautiful and powerful piece, perfect for the season, and which will be played again in late 2027 when we celebrate the Organ's glorious return.

The final opportunity to hear the Organ will be at the Festal Eucharist at 5.15 p.m., on **Tuesday 6 January**, for the Feast of the Epiphany. Please join us for this historic moment.
