8.30 a.m. Holy Communion (BCP): The Collect, Epistle, and Gospel for The Conversion of Saint Paul begin on page 202 of the Book of Common Prayer.

Welcome: A very warm welcome to the Cathedral, particularly if you are a visitor or here for the first time. We would be delighted to meet you, so do please make yourself known to one of the clergy after the service. Everybody is always welcome to stay and enjoy time together over tea and filter coffee after the Cathedral Eucharist, where there are Welcomers available - please do seek them out if you have questions or simply to chat.

Archdeacon of Wells: Our wonderful friend and colleague, The Venerable Anne Gell, Archdeacon of Wells, has decided to step down from her roles in Bath and Wells, in May this year. Anne has been Archdeacon of Wells and Residentiary Canon of Wells Cathedral since 2017. Between February 2023 and June 2024, Anne also played a critical role in leading the Cathedral through a time of transition as Acting Dean of Wells.

Reflecting on the news, The Very Revd Toby Wright, Dean of Wells, said: "Through her ministry as Residentiary Canon, as well as her time as Acting Dean of Wells, Anne has brought support, wisdom and healing in times of change for many at Wells Cathedral and throughout the wider community. Anne will be much missed in Wells. We will always remember with gratitude the strong foundations she has established here, on which we can now build confidently for the future. Our prayers are with Anne and her family as she discerns God's call to her next chapter."

Sunday 1 February: A labyrinth will be set up at the rear of the Nave after the Cathedral Eucharist next Sunday, and anyone who would like to learn about walking and praying through the labyrinth is welcome to come at any time between the Cathedral Eucharist and the Epiphany Procession.

Epiphany Procession, Sunday 1 February at 3.00 p.m. This special service will mark the end of the Christmas/Epiphany Season. We will celebrate the three themes of Epiphany: the Coming of the Magi, the Baptism of Christ and the Wedding at Cana, through hymns, choir carols and a procession out to St Andrew's Holy Spring in the Bishop's Palace Garden. The service will begin in the South Transept before the Magi and Christ child; we will then process through the cloister and garden to celebrate the Baptism of Christ at the Holy Spring and finally return to the Quire for the celebration of the Wedding at Cana. All are invited to stay for refreshments and a glass of wine at the end of the service.

Welcome and Installation of The Right Reverend Dr Fiona Gibson as The Bishop of Taunton: You are warmly invited to attend this service at 3.00 p.m. on **Sunday 8 February**. There will be a block of unreserved seats for congregation members and visitors from parishes across the Diocese. Although you do not need
