8.30 a.m. Holy Communion (BCP): The Collect, Epistle, and Gospel for Sexagesima begin on page 80 of the Book of Common Prayer.

Welcome: A very warm welcome to the Cathedral, particularly if you are a visitor or here for the first time. We would be delighted to meet you, so do please make yourself known to one of the clergy after the service. Everybody is always welcome to stay and enjoy time together over tea and filter coffee after the Cathedral Eucharist, where there are Welcomers available - please do seek them out if you have questions or simply to chat.

Bishop of Taunton: We are delighted to be welcoming Bishop Fiona as the new Bishop of Taunton, and Dave her husband. Bishop Fiona will be settling into her new role and we look forward very much to supporting her ministry here at the Cathedral as she gets to know the diocese, working alongside Bishop Michael. Do hold her and Dave in your prayers.

This afternoon's service of Welcome and Installation is at 3.00 p.m.. There will be a block of unreserved seats for congregation members and visitors from parishes across the Diocese. The congregation are asked to be seated by 2.40 p.m..

Racial Justice Sunday: At the Cathedral Eucharist this morning we will be welcoming the Reverend Canon Sonia Barron as our preacher. Canon Sonia is former Co-chair of the Church of England's Anti-Racism Taskforce and member of the Archbishops' Commission for Racial Justice.

Ash Wednesday: Ash Wednesday this year falls on **Wednesday 18 February**. There will be three opportunities to attend a Eucharist, where the Imposition of Ashes will also be offered:

5.15 p.m. Solemn Eucharist, with incense, sung by Wells Cathedral Chamber Choir

No prior musical experience required, just curiosity and a willingness to experiment!

Lunchtime Organ Recital Thursday 12 February at 1.05 p.m.: This month's recital will be given by Tom Winpenny, a Freelance Organist and Choral Director. An award-winning organist, Tom Winpenny will be giving the inaugural recital in the 2026 Lunchtime Organ Recital series. In the absence of our Cathedral pipe organ, he will be putting the digital Viscount organ through its paces with a programme of works of by Mozart, Price, and Hakim, among others. Tom Winpenny was Assistant Master of the Music and Director of the Cathedral Girls Choir at St Albans Cathedral 2008–2024. His recording of the organ works of Florence Price on the Naxos label was Album of the Week on Radio 3's Essential Classics in December 2025. Please do come and support this recital!
