The Second Sunday of Lent

Sunday 1 March 2026



8.30 a.m. Holy Communion (BCP): The Collect, Epistle, and Gospel for the Second Sunday in Lent begin on page 88 of the Book of Common Prayer.

The Dean is presiding and preaching at St Mary Magdalene, Wookey Hole, and St Cuthbert's, Wells, this morning.

The Cathedral Curate is presiding and preaching at St Lawrence's, Priddy.

Welcome: A very warm welcome to the Cathedral, particularly if you are a visitor or here for the first time. Do please make yourself known to one of the clergy after the service. Everybody is always welcome to stay and enjoy time together over tea and filter coffee after the Cathedral Eucharist, where there are Welcomers available - please do seek them out if you have questions or simply to chat.

The Open Door Service: The Open Door Service will take place in the Nave on **Monday 9 March at 10.15 a.m.**, during which the Dean will commission and bless all the volunteers who work to welcome visitors to our Cathedral. There will be refreshments in the North Transept after the service, and all staff and volunteers at the Cathedral are warmly invited to attend and mark this important occasion.

Lunchtime Organ Recital: On **Thursday 12 March at 1.05 p.m.**, Gavin Phelps, our Junior Organ Scholar, will give a lunchtime organ recital. Healing Prayer Ministry: In this Diocesan Year of Prayer, we are hoping to grow a team to offer prayer ministry after the Cathedral Eucharist. We begin with a taster session on prayer on **Monday 16 March 10.00 a.m. - 12.30 p.m.** in the Education Room. You are invited to come and explore prayer as listening, presence, and relationship with God. The session will include short reflections, simple prayer practices, and space for quiet personal reflection. This will be an opportunity to explore and discern your own prayer life.

Following the taster session, you may like to go on to explore how prayer for one another can be a ministry of transformation and healing, how to offer it safely, how to listen well to God, to ourselves, to one another. There will be two days of training as part of a wider discernment process, in the Education Room, on **Saturday 11 April and Friday 17 April, 9.30 a.m. - 4.00 p.m.**, led by the Reverend Prebendary Narinder Tegally and Caroline Bruce. This will give space for simple, personal reflection: you will explore new ways of praying and notice God's presence woven through everyday life.
