8.30 a.m. Holy Communion (BCP): The Collect, Epistle, and Gospel for the Fifth Sunday After Easter begin on page 142 of the Book of Common Prayer.

Welcome: A very warm welcome to the Cathedral, particularly if you are a visitor or here for the first time. Do please make yourself known to one of the clergy after the service. Everybody is always welcome to stay and enjoy time together over tea and filter coffee after the Cathedral Eucharist, where there are Welcomers available - please do seek them out if you have questions or simply to chat.

The Archdeacon of Wells departs: As you know Archdeacon Anne is stepping down from her roles in Bath and Wells. Anne will be presiding for the last time as Archdeacon at the Cathedral Eucharist this morning, and also preaching at Choral Evensong this afternoon. There will be a drinks reception for Anne after Evensong to which you are all warmly invited.

Acting Archdeacon of Wells: During the coming months, the Venerable Jonathan Lloyd will be the Acting Archdeacon of Wells. Interviews for the next Archdeacon of Wells will take place in May and it is hoped the new appointment will begin in September. A longstanding commitment means that Jonathan will not be with us during the month of June. During this time, support for the Archdeaconry of Wells will be provided by the Archdeacons of Taunton and Bath.

Recruitment to the Cathedral's Board of Trustees: The Cathedral is seeking to appoint two new non-executive lay members to Chapter (the Board of Trustees) who can bring strategic leadership skills or expertise in property management. Chapter wish to strengthen links with the worshipping community and also seek to improve diversity in the trustee body and encourage anyone with relevant skills to consider joining them. Taste and See: The Cathedral Meditation Group is an opportunity to share in thirty minutes of silent prayer which follows a brief introduction. Such prayer is a chance to deepen our personal relationship with God and to contribute to the prayer-life of the

Cathedral. All are most welcome. The next session will be on **Monday 11 May**, at 6.00 p.m. in the Lady Chapel. If you are just coming for the meditation, please enter via the North Door.

Called to Pray: There has been considerable interest in the *Called to Pray* initiative. Following reflection, it has seemed wise to allow this ministry to develop in an organic and sustainable way, enabling both prayer and relationships to deepen over time. Rather than a single stand-alone event, the training is therefore proposed as a series of fortnightly sessions, offering a more spacious and reflective context in which a community of prayer may be formed.

The sessions are planned for **Thursday afternoons from 2.00–4.00 p.m. during May and June**, with the opportunity to attend **Choral Evensong at 5.15 p.m.** together. The dates for the sessions are: 14 May, 28 May, 11 June and 25 June in the Lady Chapel.
